You Decide 2020

Following the success of previous years' 'You Decide' grants, Tadley Town Council are again offering local clubs and groups this opportunity for 2020 and, as before, the residents of Tadley will be asked to look at the various grants being sought and to vote for their choice at the Annual Town Meeting on 7 March 2020.

This is an opportunity for any local club or group who have a small project in mind for which they require additional funding, to apply for up to £2,000. Providing the club or group serves the people of Tadley and meets the criteria of the grant, they can apply. Application packs are available on our website or from the office, details above. Each club and group will have the opportunity of talking to residents at the Annual Town Meeting about their group and their project and the residents will then vote for their choice.

For the clubs and groups, it is an easy way to not only apply for a grant but to let the people of Tadley know what their organisation does and for the residents it is an opportunity to have their say in who receives the grants.

Tadley Environmental Group

At the 2 September meeting of the Tadley Town Full Council meeting it was agreed to create an environment working group to look at, among other things, air quality in Tadley. The first meeting was held on 7 October when three Tadley Town Councillors and borough councillor, (Kerry Carruthers) attended. It was agreed to name the committee Tadley Environmental Group (TEG). Former members of the Tadley Active Streets Campaign have been invited to be part of this group, as well as all Tadley Councillors; and Tadley residents are also very welcome to join.

A number of actions have been proposed, some of which are:

- air monitoring
- engaging others interested in environmental issues
- tree planting
- green infrastructure
- encouraging the installation of solar panels/heat pumps/storage batteries
- improving building insulation
- electric vehicles and charging
- cycle routes through Tadley,
- plastic use and recycling.

The Tadley council web site is also being developed and now includes a separate environmental page. Volunteers are being sought to join existing actions and projects and all councillors and residents are encouraged to suggest additional issues and themes.
